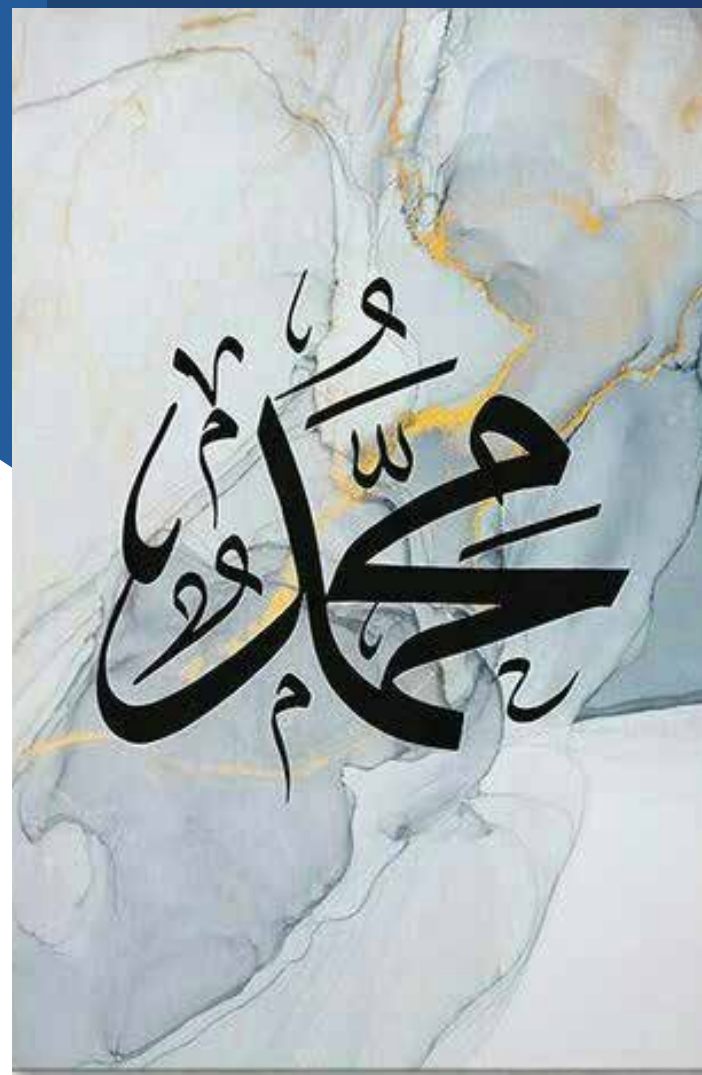

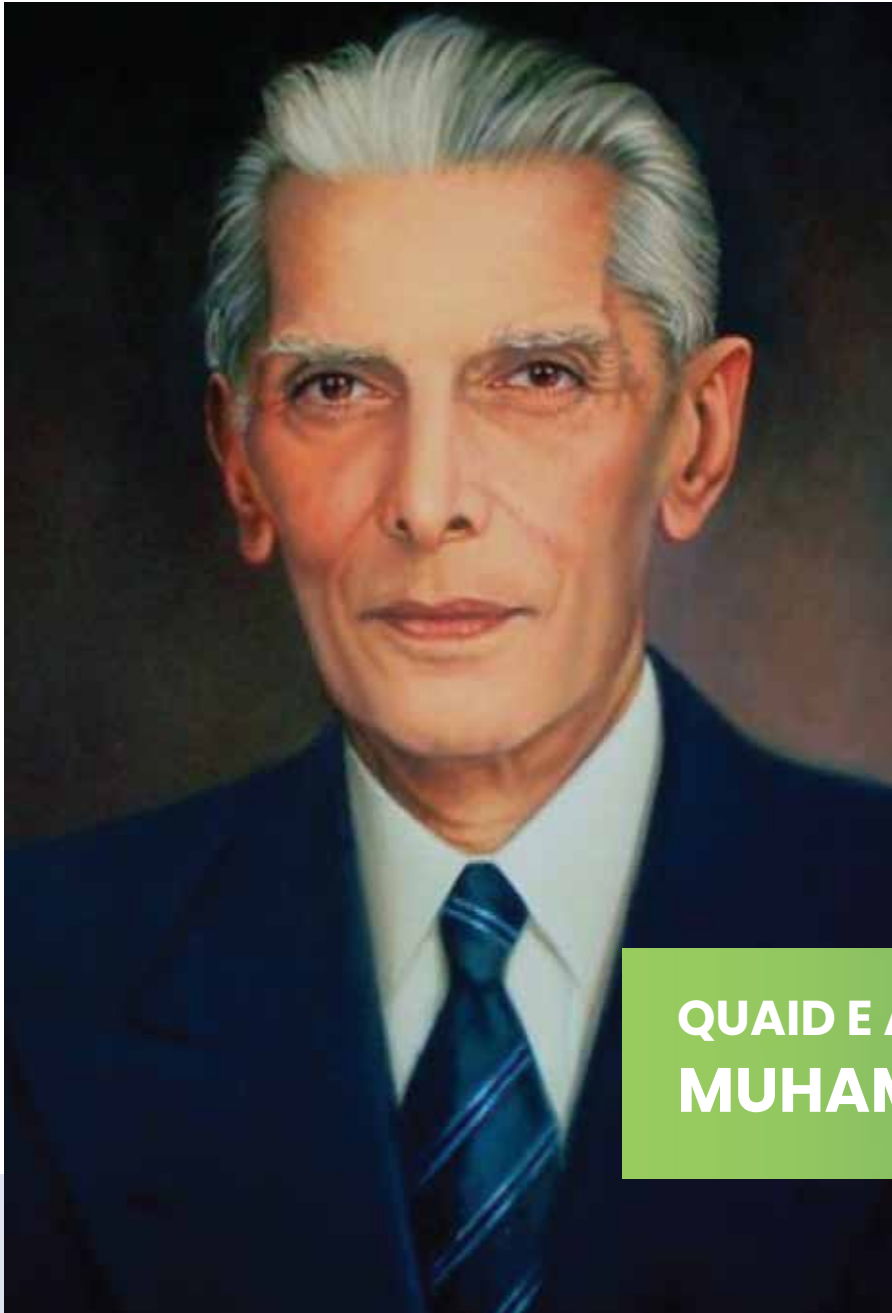

The Charter of the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences was approved on 21st November 2011 and was initially established as a campus of University of Sindh, Jamshoro .



Now, USMS is itself an independent institute and Prof. Dr. Parveen Munshi has been appointed as the 1st Vice Chancellor of the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences, Bhitshah . The Higher Education Commission, Islamabad granted NOC for admission to the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences, Bhitshah on Thursday 22 -05 -2019. The officials of the HEC Inspection team visited the university on 27 April 2019 to inspect the educational, administrative and physical infrastructure of the University, in which they found the university fulfilling the criteria for accreditation . The Inspection team officials were recommended for admissions grant that HEC approved and granted Non -Objection Certificate (NOC) for undergraduate programs that include Business Administration, Commerce, Computer Science, Information Technology and Education.

The USMS is an institution of higher education with a mission to create a transformative educational environment for attracting and retaining diverse national talent. A collaborative environment where research, creativity, innovation, tolerance, harmony and humanity can flourish. Candidates who have passed HSC-II/Intermediate Examination or equivalent is eligible to seek admission to the relevant (undergraduate 4 years Program) course provided that he/she fulfil the requirements of minimum percentage i.e., 50% marks. Whereas for BS SOFTWARE ENGINEERING candidates with HSC-II(Pre-Engineering) background are eligible only.

LLB (5-YEAR) Program

Candidates who have qualified the HEC LAW ADMISSION TEST (LAT) are eligible only.

B. Ed. (2.5-Year) Secondary

Candidates must have B.Sc. / BA/ B. Com or equivalent with 50% marks passed in semester/annual examination from any HEC recognized University / Institution.

B. Ed. (1.5-Year) Secondary

Candidates must have 16 years of Education in any subject with 50% marks passed in semester/annual examination from any HEC recognized University / Institution.

EXAMINATION POLICY

ATTENDANCE

- Attendance in classes is mandatory.
- A student should have at least 75% attendance to appear in the Final Semester Examination.
- The eligibility attendance of Theory/ Practical for late admitted students to First Semester of First Year only shall be calculated from the date of admission.

COMPUTATION OF SEMESTER GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) AND CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE (CGPA)

This is a figure ranging preferably from 0.00 to 4.00 be used to indicate the performance of a student in the semester concerned.

- **GPA**= Sum over all courses in a Semester (Course Credit Hours x Grade Point Earned) divided by Total Semester Credit Hours
- **CGPA**= Sum over all taken courses in all Semesters (Course Credit Hours x Grade Point Earned) divided by Total Credit Hours taken in all Semester

CGPA REQUIRED FOR THE COMPLETION OF UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE

For completion of the degree, the minimum qualifying CGPA for undergraduate students is 2.00.

- In case a student secures less than 2.00 CGPA (minimum qualifying CGPA) at the end of final Semester, s/he may be allowed to get re-admission in one or more courses, in which his/her Grade is below C, along with the forthcoming semester, provided that s/he is not debarred under the CGPA Improvement Regulation and time duration specified for the program.

EXAMINATION POLICY

TRANSFER OF CREDIT HOURS FOR UNDERGRADUATE

- Credits are transferred on course-to-course basis i.e. a person taking course A at University X is allowed to transfer his/her credits to University Y provided that course A is equivalent to course B taught at the Y University.
- No credit hour of a course will be transferred if the grade is less than C for undergraduate
- HEIs are at liberty to enroll students (if they fulfill their criteria) for any semester or for any single class and issue the students a transcript for the courses completed.
- Credit hours may only be transferred between duly recognized HEIs and internationally recognized universities.

REQUIREMENT FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

- A student must have a regular admission in the Undergraduate program of the University and should earn a minimum of 60 credit hours out of a total of 124–140 credit hours from the university from where s/he will be entitled for the degree.



EXAMINATION POLICY

INDISCIPLINE IN EXAMINATIONS

- Any candidate found guilty of following matters; his/her case will be submitted to Unfair Means Cases Committee constituted by the University. This committee will be constituted of 02 senior faculty members, Director of student's affairs, headed by senior Professor of the University.
 - i. Removes a leaf from his/her answer book, the answer book shall be cancelled.
 - ii. Submits forged or fake documents in connection with the examination.
 - iii. Commits impersonation in the examination.
 - iv. Copies from any paper, book or notes.
 - v. Mutilates the Answer Book.
 - vi. Possesses any kind of material, which may be helpful to his/her in the examination.
 - vii. Does anything that is immoral or illegal in connection with the examination and which may be helpful to him/her in the examination.
 - viii. Refuses to obey the invigilation staff or refuses to follow the instructions issued by the University in connection with the examination.
 - ix. misbehaves or creates any kind of disturbance in or around the examination center.
 - x. Uses abusive or obscene language on the answer script.
 - xi. Possesses any kind of weapon in or around examination center.
 - xii. Possesses any kind of electronic device which may be helpful in the examination

His/her case shall result in penalties keeping in view the nature and intensity of offence.

- i. Cancellation of paper*.
- ii. Suspension from program for one semester.
- iii. Heavy and light Fine
- iv. Expulsion forever from the University.
- v. Any other.

*Unfair Means Cases Committee will decide that the student will have to appear in summer semester/with regular semester for the cancelled paper.

EXAMINATION POLICY

APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION OF THE UNFAIR MEANS CASES COMMITTEE

- If a student is not satisfied by the decision of the Unfair Means Cases Committee, s/he can submit his/her appeal within a week after the decision of the Committee to the Vice Chancellor. No appeal shall lie against the decision of the Syndicate.

PROBATION

Probation is a status granted to the student whose academic performance falls below the minimum University standard.

- 1 The students acquiring less than 2.00/4.00 GPA in a semester but passing in all papers will be promoted with the condition to achieve more than 2.0 GPA in the next semester and s/he will be put on probation for the next semester.
- 2 The students acquiring GPA 1.7 and above but failing in any paper(s) will be placed on probation and promoted to the next semester conditionally. They will have to be registered for summer semester to improve the grade.
- 3 Students acquiring GPA less than 1.70 in two consecutive semesters and failing in any paper(s) even after attending summer semester for one academic year will be dropped from university rolls. However, s/he will be eligible to seek re-admission. Re-admission will be allowed only once for 4 years BS degree program. Re-admission will be allowed after the payment of full admission fee and the student will be considered as external candidate) and two years.
- 4 Students on probation in two consecutive semesters even after attending Summer Semester in one academic year will take re-admission in that particular academic year once only.
- 5 There will be maximum two academic probations in four-year Bachelor degree program. Both the probations cannot be granted / availed in first four semesters. A student who is on probation 2nd time even after attending summer semester in first four semesters shall be removed from rolls of university. However, s/he can take re-admission only once for 4 years BS degree program.
- 6 In case of valid reason / excuse, the period of study may be extended for one additional year (Two Semesters) in all university programs. The student(s) who will not complete studies within stated periods including extension shall be struck off from the rolls of the university. The students who have been given the right to extend the duration of study for one additional year are required to pay new registration fee along with normal fee for that academic year.
- 7 It is also mandatory to obtain at least 50% marks in Practical, Projects, Thesis, Assignments, Test and Theory Paper separately/aggregate.

EXAMINATION POLICY

PERMISSION OF WRITER FOR SPECIAL STUDENTS

- A visually impaired student may be allowed to attempt the Mid/Final Examinations of the University on Braille/ Computer/any other means of facilitation.
- In case a student is physically handicapped/visually impaired, s/he may apply to the Chairperson of the respective department (with medical certificate as proof of her/his disability) for permission to engage a writer in Tests/ Examinations of the University two weeks before the start of Tests/ Examinations. S/he will be allowed 45 minutes (maximum) extra time to solve the question paper.
- The qualification of the person who acts as writer of a handicapped student must be at least one step lower than that of the student. (e.g. for level 6 student, the writer should be at the most of level 5).

RECHECKING OF EXAMINATION SCRIPT

- The answer book of a candidate shall not be re-assessed under any circumstances.
 - a. **Whereas the re-checking does not mean re-assessment/re-evaluation/re-marking of the answer book. The Controller of Examination can arrange for re-checking of examination script by any faculty member from the relevant discipline on the complaint/request of students. The Controller of Examination or any officer or re-checking committee appointed shall see that:**
 - (i) There is no computational mistake in the grand total on the title page of the answer book.
 - (ii) The total of various parts of a question has been correctly made at the end of each question.
 - (iii) All totals have been correctly brought forward on the title page of the answer book.
 - (iv) No portion of any answer has been left un-marked.
 - (v) Total marks in the answer book tally with the marks sheet.
 - (vi) The hand-writing of the candidate tally in the questions/answer book.
 - b. **The candidate or anybody on his behalf has no right to see or examine the answer books for any purpose.**
 - c. **The marks of a candidate could even decrease in light of (a) (iii) above. In the event of reduction of marks the record shall be corrected accordingly and revised transcript will be issued.**

EXAMINATION POLICY

DAMAGED/LOST ANSWER SCRIPT

- In an exceptional case where an answer script is damaged, lost or destroyed due to unavoidable circumstances, then the student may be given the following options:
 - i Average marks shall be awarded to the student in that subject/course.
 - ii In case of Final Examination, if the candidate so desires, s/he shall be given another chance as a special case to take the Examination in that subject/course in the next examination and no examination fee shall be charged from the student.
 - iii In case of Internal Assessment, if the candidate so desires, s/he shall be given another chance as a special case to take the Make-up Assessment in that subject/course in the same academic session.

MATTERS RELATED TO DEGREES CONFERMENT

- i. University should conduct Convocation once in a year to award the degrees to the qualified students as per criteria.
- ii. Urgent degree can be issued as per policy of University upon the request of student.
- iii. Duplicate Degree may be issued (with completion of all requirements) to a candidate in case the original degree is lost/damaged or in case of change in the name of candidate. The candidate has to apply to the Controller of Examinations for the issuance of duplicate degree along with the relevant documentary proof as per University rules.
- iv. The Duplicate Degree shall be signed by the Controller of Examinations only.

EXAMINATION POLICY

AWARDS AND DISTINCTIONS

- i. Medals/Prizes/Rolls of Honor/Positions will be awarded to the students passing their examinations papers in the Semester System in the first attempt.
- ii. In the Semester System, Letter Grades will be awarded on the basis of GP / GPA / CGPA, and Positions would be given on the basis of CGPA. In case two or more students are acquiring same CGPA only then the Position would be decided on the basis of percentage among those students.
- iii. Every disciplines need minimum 70% marks for eligibility for declared position
- iv. No medal and roll of honor will be granted to candidates who passed the examination in 2nd attempt.
- v. The result of the candidate is not declared within the prescribed time of the degree, then no medal will be awarded.
- vi. No Medal/Roll of Honor will be awarded in the case of improving CGPA.

In each semester, students may be required to appear in quizzes, tests, midterms, final examinations, presentations (individual/group), group discussion, and submit projects/assignments/lab reports etc. These assessment marks (to be determined by the teacher concerned) will have different weightage contributing towards the overall assessment in percent marks. This weightage may be determined on the basis of following guidelines:

Distribution of Marks for assessment for subjects with 3+1 and 2+1 CH and 3+0 and 2+0 CH

- ◆ There will be no Supplementary/Special Examination in a Semester System; if a student fails in a course, s/he is required to repeat it.
- ◆ Examinations has two portions, 60 and 40 percent, 60 for assignment, presentation and mid semester examination and 40 for final examination.
- ◆ If student fails in final examination, he/she will also be considered as "Fail" in the 60 percent examination portion and would be re-admitted in the same subject/ course.
- ◆ Note: In case of a course with the composition of 4(3+1), (03 credit hour theory and 01 credit hour practical) the weightage for the practical may be considered 25%.

MIGRATION POLICY

MIGRATION FROM USMS BHITSHAH

- Students desiring to leave the University shall apply to the Register in the prescribe form on payment of the prescribe fee.
- No Migration Certificate shall be issued to a student who has been debarred from appearing at an examination or expelled from University for misconduct till such time as the period of punishment lasts.
- If a student after taking a migration Certificate does not join any other University and wishes to re you this University, he shall surrender the Migration Certificate issue to him, which will be cancelled, and his name may be restored in the register of students.

MIGRATION TO USMS BHITSHA

The admission on migration basis from other universities to USMS Bhitshah shall be considered allowed if the students have cleared all the subjects/papers from the Past Examination from the parent University.

ENROLMENT POLICY

- No student shall be eligible to appear at any University examination unless he/she is enrolled with the University on payment of the prescribed fees.
- Application for enrolment on prescribed for supported by the necessary certificates shall be submitted to the Deputy Register, through the Principal of the affiliated college or the Director/Chairperson of the teaching department, as the case may be, within one months from the last date of admission.
- If a student remains unenrolled at the end of the above period. His/her name may be removed from the University and affiliated College, as the case may be.
- Each student shall receive an Enrolment Card bearing Enrolment Number. If an enrolment card is lost or destroyed, a duplicate copy of it will be issued on payment of prescribed fee.
- No application for admission to a University examination or for any other purpose shall be received from un-enrolled students unless the Enrolment Number is quoted in the prescribed application form for admission to a University examination

POLICY AGAINST HARASSMENT

The university is strictly adhered to the HEC defined Policy against harassment in Higher institutes of Pakistan. However, a committee has been formed for dealing with all cases of harassment at University of Sufism and Modern Sciences Bhitshah.

Higher Education Institutions (“HEIs”) are highly consequential institutions in society that are dedicated to the pursuit and dissemination of knowledge. Members of the HEI community have several important rights and privileges, central among which is the right to pursue inquiry and search for knowledge without hinderance from unlawful or otherwise unacceptable constraints. The Higher Education Commission (the “HEC”), which has been mandated by law to prescribe conditions under which HEIs in the country may be opened and operated, takes very seriously the freedom of teachers, researchers, scholars, students and other members of the HEI community to live and work in a safe environment in which their dignity is protected.

Effective implementation of harassment Act might be inevitable to acquiring gender equality in higher education institutions and diminishing the influence of patriarchal and conservative mind set. This policy intended to explore implementation of the harassment Act (2010) in universities. Although Government of Pakistan has enforced harassment Act and Higher Education Commission (HEC) made it mandatory to implement. Various incidence of harassment has been reported by study participants and in certain cases, victims are asked to resign the jobs as they refuse or fail to comply with the drives of male colleagues and heads. Lack of state and organizational control leads women to be silent and tolerant of harassment and ultimately, it encourages perpetrator to continue the derogatory behavior.

According to the HEC's guidelines, the complaint cell is supposed to be headed by a full-time trained professional, designated as a harassment monitoring officer. It has also been advised that the head should preferably be a female, considering the fact that a majority of complaints are reported by female students.

The policy has categorized the acts of asking a female student to visit an office after office hours, to meet outside university premises and sexual jokes or written or spoken references as sexual harassment. Intimidating a student about damaging their reputation, commenting on an individual's physique, staring, inquiries about a student's sexual experiences and acts connoting sexuality, among other acts, also amount to harassment.

Ideally the Higher education Institutes (HEIs) are places where administrators, faculty, employee/staff, and students (all levels/categories) work and learn in an environment free from intimidating, offensive, and hostile behaviors. Sexual harassment vitiates such an environment. Therefore, each member of the HEI campuses must have mechanisms to-provide their members with the opportunity to develop Intellectually, professionally, personally, ethically, morally and socially in a fair and humane environment.

OFFICE OF RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND COMMERCIALIZATION (ORIC)

HEC has started working to organize the research activities of universities/HEIs by ensuring availability of well-established and fully functional ORIC (Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization) in public/private sector Universities of the country. Therefore, ORIC USMS was established in 2016 under the directives of HEC in HEIs (Higher Education Institutions).

VISION

To promote and strengthen research culture in USMS and link the industry with university which would encourage and accelerate the process of creation and diffusion of knowledge that would serve the objective of establishment of HEI.

AIMS OF ORIC-USMS

- To promote high quality of research which classifies USMS as among the best research oriented HEIs.
- To provide strategic and operational support to the USMS's research activities/program, and to have a central role in facilitating the USMS's research outcomes.
- To strengthen university-industry linkage through ORIC.
- Providing support to the students and faculty in their research.
- To apply the research practically in order to improve the economy of the country.
- To develop partnerships with universities to form joint research ventures.
- To work out for the publication of the research work carried out in the university.

Under PERN HEC Pakistan's umbrella, the university is registered with Microsoft Office 365 to assist teachers and students in video conferencing and online courses.



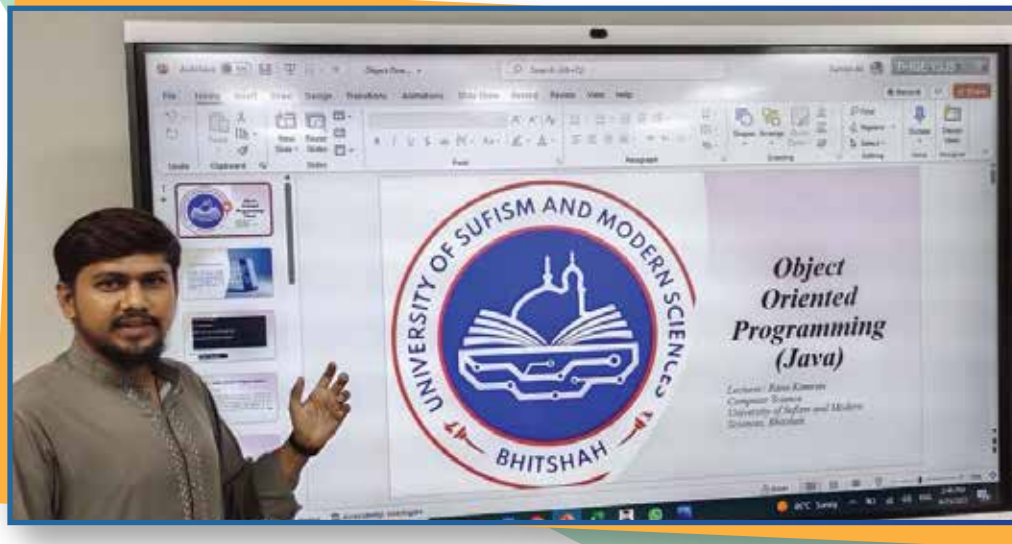

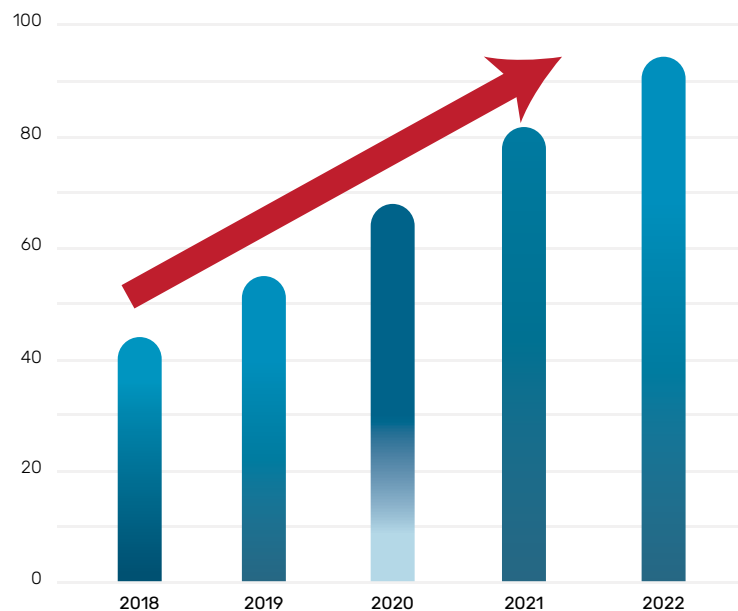


QUALITY ENHANCEMENT CELL (QEC)

The land was transferred on 20-05-2019 via Mukhtiarkar Taluka Hala, properly registered with Sub-Registrar Taluka Hala and Revenue Board Hyderabad, in the Record of Rights of the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences, Bhitshah.



The Government of Sindh approved the scheme with a cost of Rs. 1042.776 million titled: "Establishment of the University of Sufism and Moderns Sciences" under the Annual Development Scheme No. 534 (2019-20), now called On-going scheme with ADP # 861 (2022-23). The University Project with a cost of Rs. 464.107 million was approved under Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) by the Departmental Development Working Party, Higher Education Commission Islamabad on April 15, 2021, for a period of three years titled: "Provision of New/Additional facilities and infrastructure, University of Sufism and Modern Sciences Bhitshah Sindh.
